"This gentle form of exercise can help maintain strength, flexibility, and balance, and could be the perfect activity for the rest of your life. Tai Chi might well be called "medication in motion". There is growing evidence that this mind-body practice, which originated in China as a martial art, has value in treating or preventing many health problems. And you can get started even if you aren't in top shape or the best of health." (Harvard Medical School Health Publications). This exercise class is led by certified instructor, Deirdre Dwyer, who will explain the benefits of Tai Chi and will teach the basic Tai Chi movements. Tai Chi can be done standing or sitting, so Deirdre will demonstrate chair and standing exercises as she goes through each exercise. The price is \$5.00 for each class.
